Artistic Donation



During the artistic national championships, Xananda Wollard donated the costumes worn by his father Robert Wollard and partner Carol Stout. Skating in the 1950s, Wollard and Stout won numerous national titles including Senior Pairs in 1959 and 1960, Junior Fours 1957, Junior Pairs 1957, and Sophomore Pairs 1956.



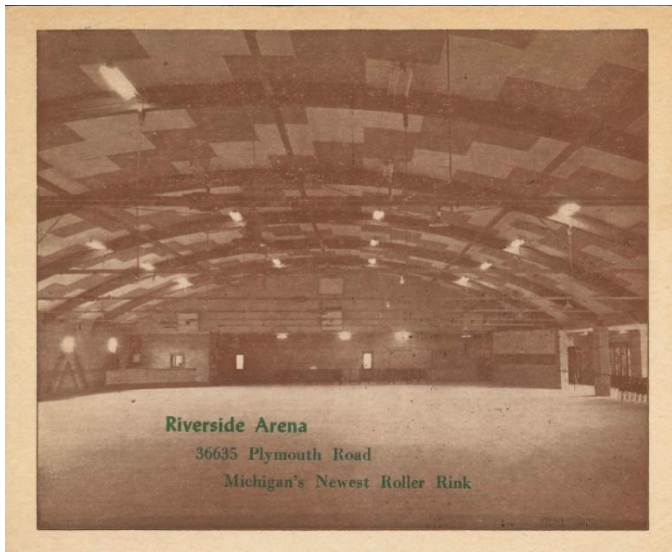
Wollard and Stout were elected into the USA Roller Sports Athletes Hall of Fame this year. USARS states that: *Robbie and Carol Ann were noted for their pairs skating spontaneity and innovations at Nationals, including their "dropped impossible" spin and other spectacular pairs movements. In 1960 the two drew a standing ovation by introducing the famous "sleeping beauty" spin during their Senior Pairs win. They were widely admired by their peers who often sought to replicate both their style and content.*

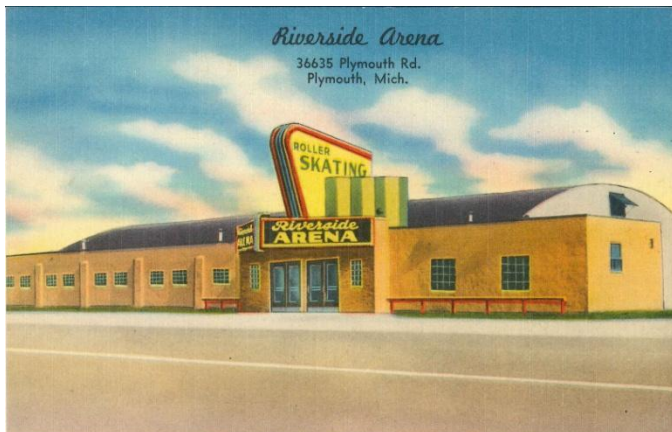

Livonia Rink Donation

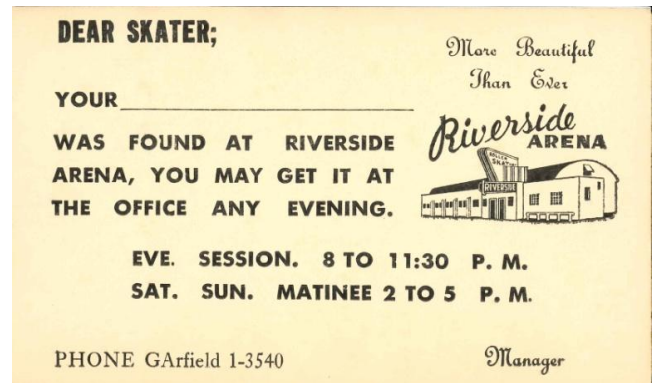

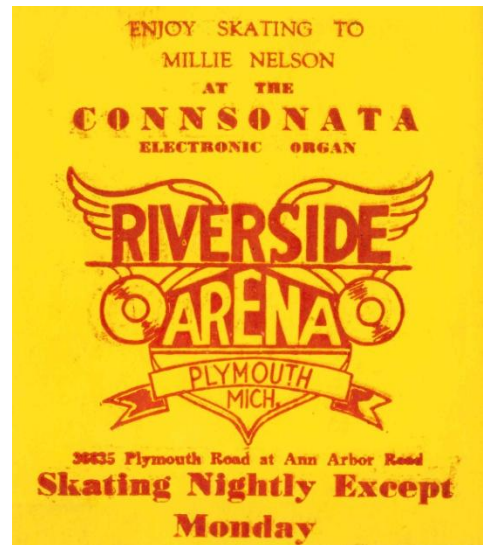
The above postcard reads on the back as follows:
You will find Riverside Arena a fine place for the young folks of your congregation to spend an evening. Riverside is one of the finest roller rinks in Michigan. Plenty of room to handle big parties, ample parking, modern refreshment room, a clean, well managed establishment. Skating sessions begin at 7:45 each evening except Mondays. By the special arrangement our bus will transport all of part of your party.



Riverside Arena is located seven miles from Detroit city limits on US highway 12 with a half acre to play and two acres to park.
